IMPACT REPORT

NEAR SOUTH SIDE ROSC (NSSR)

During FY26, the ROSC Council actively engaged community partners around our top priorities of sustainable housing, employment opportunities for individuals living with mental health disorders, and increasing awareness of sober community events. Engagement primarily occurred through our monthly ROSC meetings, where these priorities were consistently discussed as part of our strategic plan.

The council used these meetings as a platform to:

- Review and reinforce strategic plan goals
- Share community resources and opportunities related to housing, employment, and recovery support
- Encourage collaboration among organizations serving individuals impacted by mental health and substance use challenges
- Promote sober community events and recovery-focused activities
- Strengthen relationships between service providers, community organizations, and local stakeholders

By maintaining ongoing conversations and resource-sharing, the ROSC Council helped keep community partners aligned around shared goals and community needs. Although all populations are important, the council placed special emphasis on supporting individuals and communities impacted by gun violence and trauma related to gun violence. Through outreach, community engagement, and partnerships with organizations and initiatives such as CAPS, we helped increase awareness of trauma-informed support services, mental health resources, and recovery-focused opportunities for those affected by violence and related challenges. The work completed this year helped improve community engagement, strengthen partnerships, and increase awareness of recovery resources and sober community events within our service area. While large-scale community system changes take time, meaningful progress was made by building stronger connections with organizations, increasing visibility at community events, and encouraging ongoing collaboration among behavioral health providers, recovery advocates, and community stakeholders.
