Discussion:

- This month's call was a level-setting for Fiscal Year 27, and informational for Fiscal Year 26. What was done? What was our impact?
- The call began with Stephanie explaining that Daryl is out on PTO but will be back next month. In his stead, she shared with the Council a draft of the Fiscal Year 26 Impact Report that we will be submitting to Illinois next month. The Impact Report shows our ROSC Priorities, Partners, and Community Impact.

Together We Thrive.

- Youth trust and engagement has increased
 - Harm Reduction Resources are more visible and accessible
- Stephanie further shared that the next goal as we head into FY27 is to increase Harm Reduction Education and Access throughout the Council. ROSC Councils are the drivers of Recovery Oriented Systems of Care throughout the state, and our Council will direct community change through individual Council Members.
 - Council Members will be trained and educated on naloxone and how to use it.
 - Council Members will be provided supplies, and access to Kenneth Young Center's naloxone distribution as a support.
 - A ROSC goal is to have 25 robust organizations working together to enhance and increase Harm Reduction visibility and access.
 - If Council Members are amenable, KYC will install a naloxone box at their work location, and then provide ongoing supplies, support, and education.
- Our ROSC will hold 1 in-person meeting per quarter, most likely hosted at Kenneth Young Center. Our Council will have lunch, and combine our meeting with training and education. **The kickoff in person event will be held on September 22, 2026. Looking forward to seeing everyone in person!**
- Our ROSC will create and distribute a newsletter. This newsletter can feature writings or ads from our Council Members, and will be distributed both physically (print) and online via social media.
- As this call was more informational than discussion-based, we ended the call.
